How to do research

Abstract

The course will cover the entire process needed during a research study, from the initial phase in which a new problem is addressed, formalized, and solved, up to the final phase in which the achieved results have to be communicated to the scientific community. The course is divided in 10 lectures of 3 hours each. It will explain the meaning of research and how to approach the various steps involved in the process. Topics include how to structure scientific papers, organize the different sections, make figures, cite references, and avoid common mistakes. Then, the course explains how the scientific publication process works and how to participate in it, simulating a typical paper selection process of a conference. Other parts are focused on how to write successful research projects and how to make effective presentations, good slides, and have the appropriate attitude when presenting the work. The course will finish by simulating a small conference where each student will present his paper written during the course.
